Family homeless service providers and their committed leaders need and deserve our support. Through the Housing ASAP program, a network of providers receives help with capacity building, data practices, program development, leadership coaching, and collaboration. These resources are developing stronger organizations with forward-thinking leadership to improve outcomes for homeless families.

HousingASAP **Goal**



To build a statewide network of homeless service providers who will move more homeless families into stable housing faster and help them stay there.

Housing ASAP focuses on four primary strategies to achieve its goal:

- Form a network that will collaborate, coordinate, and share information with each other.
- 2 Improve organizational adaptability and leadership.
- Enhance their performance by using data to make decisions and show achievement.
- Better equip organizations with skills to influence policy and funding changes.


Results in 2016

In 2016, Housing ASAP network organizations placed 238 families into permanent housing — in total, 653 families were placed into permanent housing since 2014.

Housing ASAP network members' emergency shelters moved homeless families into permanent housing 24% faster and reduced the average number of days in shelters from 166 to 126 days. Network organizations' transitional shelters reduced stays by 9%.

The network's impact on family homelessness in Hawai'i will be demonstrated in four concrete outcomes:



Increase the number of families placed in stable housing.



Reduce the time required to place families in stable housing.



Increase the number of families who remain in stable housing.



Develop a network of change agents and increase collaboration among organizations and providers serving homeless families.
