



WHATISTHE RECSSA?

THE RECSSA IS:



- The Resilient Early Childhood System Self-Assessment (RECSSA) is a systems tool, designed to break down the process and identify primary indicators of change to help guide organizations and communities towards deeper, systemic changes required to be trauma-informed.
- It is a self-assessment tool to help community partners better understand their systems-change process and make informed strategic decisions.

WHAT DOES THE RECSSA MEASURE?

THE RECSSA MEASURES:

The RECSSA framework measures four system domain areas:

- Leadership
- Quality Improvement (Programs)
- Infrastructure (Organization)
- Partnerships and Alignment (Community)





RECSSA DOMAINS & OUTCOMES:

Each of the domains contain three desired outcomes each.

Each of the outcome items are rated on a 4-point rating scale.

- 1 Awareness
- 2 Building
- 3 Emerging
- 4 Developed





WHO IS THE RECSSAFOR?

EARLY CHILDHOOD SYSTEM:

The RECSSA is intended for all the parties who comprise the early childhood system. These organizations include but are not limited to:

- Early Childhood Programs
- Childcare/Early Learning Programs
- Head Start Programs
- Preschools
- Early Childhood Committees or Coalitions
- Intermediary organizations





TEAM MEMBERS:



- The tool is intended to collect feedback and include the collective knowledge of all members of the organization.
- Organizations are encouraged to complete the tool and review the results as a team.
- Organization teams include a variety of roles, including but not limited to:
 - Support Staff (e.g. administrative support)
 - Direct Service (e.g. teachers, aides)
 - Management (e.g. supervisor, manager)
 - Executive Level (e.g. Executive Director)
 - Volunteer (e.g. parents, interns)

HOW FREQUENTLY SHOULD IT BE ADMINISTERED?

FREQUENCY:

- The RECSSA may be administered at a frequency that works for the organization.
- Most organizations would benefit from completing the tool every 1 to 2 years.
