

FAQ:

- **Can an organization apply for both Round 1 and Round 2 of grantmaking?**
 - Yes, organizations can apply for both rounds but need to ensure they are not “double-dipping.” Proposals should be written for different programs with budget line items that do not overlap.
- **What is primary prevention? What is secondary prevention?**
 - Primary Prevention: Primary prevention activities are directed at the general population and attempt to stop maltreatment before it occurs.
 - Secondary Prevention: Secondary prevention activities with a high-risk focus are offered to populations that have one or more risk factors associated with child maltreatment, such as poverty, parental substance abuse, young parental age, parental mental health concerns, and parental or child disabilities.

- **What is an HCF final report?**
 - If your organization was awarded a grant from HCF in the past, it most likely required the completion of a written final report at the end of the grant term.
- **Are progress reports different from final reports?**
 - Yes. Progress reports are different from final reports. Progress reports are required mid-way through a grant term and usually required of multi-year grants. Organizations with current HCF grants are eligible to apply to the program if they do not have any overdue HCF final reports.
