The overall goal of the program is to support a robust local medical research community that benefits the people of Hawaiî. In 2021, funds will be awarded through one grantmaking round. Award recommendations are made by the Medical Research Advisory Committee (MRAC). The Medical Research program is supported by several funders including: the George F. Straub Trust, the Victoria S. and Bradley L. Geist Foundation, and multiple funds at the Hawaiî Community Foundation.
